Mr. Williams commented:

I would like to know how you will justify this to citizens in this community who have retired from other places of employment where our health insurance has been offered to us at a premium price and paid all our lives and I'm sure the person who you have given insurance to tonight has been offered insurance through the Police and Fire Pension Plan and they've also been offered a means of putting money away through a Drop Program to cover the costs of such things. And there's no other employer who has given us the opportunity to drop money and save it, tax free, in order to do these things. I think it will be very difficult to justify this. And as far as the Charter, I can't understand why the Charter dictates one meeting in June, July, and August but we're not following any of the other things it dictates. I think we wasted an awful lot of time and money developing the Charter for this community because it specifies that certain people are supposed to attend the meetings. One person who is a supervisor or department head is unable to attend any of our meetings because of another obligation to another city and that is a conflict of interest. Therefore, I don't see the Charter having any value in this community. That's all I'm going to say and I'm going home. If you want to speak to me, I'll be outside.
