The Traveling Vietnam Wall will be at Hartman Park in Aurora June 22-26

This wall is an 80% scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. and is nearly 400' long. The American Veterans Traveling Tribute was formed in 1998 and travels the United States showcasing the Traveling Vietnam Wall and Cost of Freedom Tribute to Honor, Respect, and Remember those who paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The show debuted in 1975 with Chuck Woolery as the host.

Pat Sajak took over as host in 1981. He holds a Guinness World Record as the longest-running game show host.

Vanna White joined the show in 1982.

Vanna has worn over 7,000 gowns on the show and has never repeated an outfit...until one game in 2020. She does not get to keep the gowns. They are returned to the designers.

Pat matches his tie to her outfit.

The puzzleboard switched from manual to computerized in 1997.

They tape a week's worth of shows in one day. They shoot 35 days a year.

Pat and Vanna make over \$10 million a year.

The show switched from prizes to money in 1989. Remember when contestants picked their prizes?

The contestants stand on risers to make them all look the same height.

The wheel is very hard to spin; it weighs 2,400 pounds.

There are 200 computerized lights on the wheel.

The show receives over 10,000 applications a year.

Only three people have won over \$1 million.

Vanna has clapped approximately 600 times per episode and she has been called "Television's Most Frequent Clapper".
