





Have you gotten a call from someone claiming to be from the Social Security Administration? If so, it is most likely a scam. This scam is circulating again and it is costing people millions of dollars. I have received three phone calls this week myself. It starts with a recording telling you your social security number is expired or suspended or involved in illegal activity and there are charges or an "officer" or the FBI needs to speak with you...HANG UP! They are trying to get your personal information and get you to pay to fix a made-up issue.

The Social Security Administration would not: Call you to demand an immediate payment; demand that you pay debt without an appeal; require a specific means of payment like a prepaid debit care; ask you for personal information or credit card numbers; or threaten you with arrest or deportation. If you receive one of these scam calls or emails, do NOT provide them with any information. You can report it to www.oig.ssa.gov/report or call 1-800-772-1213

<u>All Reminderville residents</u> voting on Election Day will go to the Reminderville Athletic Club. Voting hours are 6:30am – 7:30pm.

If you are voting by absentee ballot, you need to send in an absentee ballot application and Summit County will then mail you a ballot to fill out and return. Applications are available at **summitcountyboe.gov** or you can call Village Hall and we will print one out for you.

If you want to do early in-person voting, you need to vote at the Summit County Board of Elections located at 500 Grant St in Akron. They are open for voting weekdays 8:00-5:00 and the last weekend of October.

For Reminderville seniors who would like to register for the free driveway snow plowing program, if you were on the snow plow list last year, you do not have to fill out the application. Call Stacey at Village Hall at the number below to confirm this year's placement on the list.

If you were not on the list last year, you must be 65 years or older or be physically/medically handicapped and have no ablebodied person living in your home capable of removing snow. You must meet the low/moderate income as the cut-off point for eligibility: 1 person \$31,200

1 person	\$31,200
2 persons	\$35,650
3 persons	\$40,100

Call Stacey and an application will be mailed to you.


