Call to Order

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Wiggins moved to approve minutes from March 12, 2019. Mr. Petrovich seconded. All in favor.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Alonso reported Reminderville was ranked #2 on Niche's list of Best Places to Live in Summit County. Niche is a website that does research, rankings, and reviews. Reminderville ranked #26 out of 345 for Best Suburb to Buy a House and #48 out of 345 for Best Place to Raise a Family. The crime rate numbers they reported is off, most likely due to sharing a zip code with Aurora and Twinsburg.

Law Director

Engineering

Mr. Tucker presented a report on a stormwater management plan. He presented maps of the Village showing flood areas and ditches. OHM has set up the plan to include Data Collection, Topographic Survey, Hydrologic/Hydraulic Modeling, Alternatives Analysis, Final Reports and Recommendations, and Public Involvement and Presentations. They will look into possible alternatives including regrading/dredging of the original drainage ditches, replace drainage culverts, install a pump from Nautilus to the channel, create detention systems

upstream of the channel, and work with adjoining jurisdictions. They may also work with different agencies including Army Corps of Engineers, Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Summit Metro Parks, Aurora Shores HOA, and adjoining cities and counties. He will have a proposal at the next meeting. Mr. Petrovich asked about the timeline. Mr. Tucker said two to three months to start with meetings and the whole plan could take a year.

Service Department

Mayor Alonso reported the new floors were put in at the service garage.

Reminderville Athletic Club

Ms. Ness reported spring break camp has 85 kids registered. Summer Camp registration has started. Latchkey has 36 students in the morning and 77 in the afternoon. Registration for next year is in April and May. They are trying to get higher numbers from Aurora for the morning session so their board will approve busing, right now only Twinsburg students are in the morning session. Ms. Ness have started the assessments of the fitness instructors and classes. New classes are TRX/cycling class on Fridays 6am and Boot Camp on Tuesdays 6am. She is also working on a running club that would go to through the Ledges. She continued that revenue status is at 25% for the first three months.

Fiscal Officer

Ms. Wordell reported there has been no transfers from the JEDD fund to the RAC fund. She added the new insurance policy to Ordinance 07-2019. The new policy is increased due to coverage increases for cyber coverage and employee sexual harassment coverage.
