Call to Order

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Wiggins moved to approve the minutes from October 27, 2020. Mr. Kondik seconded. All in favor.

Acceptance of Financial Reports

Mr. Wiggins moved to accept the financial reports. Mr. DiCarlo seconded. All in favor.

Amendments to the Agenda

Mr. Hoffmann moved to add Resolution 64-2020, Resolution 65-2020, and an executive session to discuss personnel items. Mr. DiCarlo seconded. All in favor.

Marcie Kress, Executive Director for Summit County ReWorks

Ms. Kress stated ReWorks has to update their solid waste plan every five years. The plan has to show that Summit County has sufficient landfill space and they also have to demonstrate how they will achieve nine of the State's goals focused on waste reduction and recycling. The plan is open to public comment until November 25 and is available for review at their website. They are not increasing their fees and have no intention to increase in the next 15 years; they will maintain the hazardous waste recycling center in Stow; they hold document shredding events throughout the years in different locations; they have commercial recycling; scrap tire collections; recycling education effort will continue; provide grants to communities; will focus on food waste; and relocate their administrative offices to make it more publicly accessible and include a

service center. She asked that Council pass the legislation to adopt the Summit County Solid Waste Management Plan. She apologized for the short time frame.

Dave Wloch 10035 N. Surfside

Mr. Wloch asked if the Village was going to get their own leaf vacuum machine so there wasn't so much time between pick-ups. Mayor Alonso said it would cost approximately \$200,000. Mr. Wiggins added there is nothing budgeted for capital expenditures for 2021. It could possibly be a consideration after 2021.

Dave Dearth 10195 Alger Trail, Twinsburg

Mr. Dearth stated the noise emitted from the car wash at Conrad's is very loud and the light is very bright and shines in his house. It has woken him up numerous times and it is uncomfortable to sit out and enjoy his backyard. His house is located across Liberty Road in the development. He is not asking for the car wash to close down, but he is asking Council to look into resolving the issue by putting up some kind of barrier to reduce the noise and light. He said he spoke with the manager at Conrad's and was told a landscaping barrier was not approved by the Village. Mayor Alonso said that is not true.

Mahmoud Najafi 10203 Alger Trail, Twinsburg

Mr. Najafi stated he is now working from home and the noise is a disruption. Mr. Wiggins said Council will discuss the matter.
