A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT THE RESIGNATION FROM THE REMINDERVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REVOKE THE POLICE COMMISSION OF MASON EVERHART, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Mason Everhart has tendered his written resignation from the Reminderville Police Department, and

WHEREAS, such resignation being accepted, Council hereby revokes the Police Commission formerly held by Officer Mason Everhart, therefore,

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Reminderville, County of Summit, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the resignation of Officer Mason Everhart is hereby accepted and the Police Commission formerly held by Officer Everhart is hereby revoked, effective July 22, 2021.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal action by this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Reminderville, to wit: to ensure adequate police protection, and if this Resolution receives the necessary number of votes, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
