Ms. Task stated there have been complaints from HOAs about residents keeping a POD on their driveway for months and ignoring notices to remove it. Mr. Rodic recommended adding an ordinance to regulate the use of PODs or dumpsters. Ms. Jeromos felt it could go three readings rather than by emergency.
