## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF THE SUMMIT COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

- **WHEREAS**, the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") has established rules and regulations under 44 CFR Part 201.6, as authorized by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, requiring that local governments have a mitigation plan ("Plan") approved pursuant to the aforementioned section in order to receive Hazard Mitigation Grant Program ("HMGP") funds, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Summit County Emergency Management Agency ("SCEMA") is responsible to update the Plan every five years, and has updated same, and
- **WHEREAS**, after update by SCEMA, the Plan was reviewed by local agencies such as AMATS, police and fire chiefs, and the County Engineer, and was thereafter approved by the Summit County Emergency Management Executive Committee, and
- **WHEREAS**, the updated Plan, which can be viewed at City Hall, was adopted by the Council of the County of Summit, Ohio on March 18, 2024, and
- **WHEREAS**, the County has forwarded the Plan to all municipalities in the County and has requested approval thereof, and
- **WHEREAS**, Council has determined, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City of Reminderville, to approve and adopt the Plan, now, therefore,
- **BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Council of the City of Reminderville, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:
  - **SECTION 1:** That Council hereby authorizes the approval and adoption of the Summit County Hazard Mitigation Plan for calendar year 2015, which is expressly incorporated herein, and can be viewed at City Hall during regular business hours.
  - **SECTION 2.** The Council finds and determines that all formal action by this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.
  - **SECTION 3.** That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Reminderville, to wit:

to provide for purchase at the earliest possible date, and if this Resolution receives the necessary number of votes, it shall take effect and be in force after its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
