A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT THE RESIGNATION FROM THE REMINDERVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REVOKE THE POLICE COMMISSION OF JACKSON PEMBERTON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Jackson Pemberton has tendered his written resignation from the Reminderville Police Department, and

WHEREAS, such resignation being accepted, Council hereby revokes the Police Commission formerly held by Officer Jackson Pemberton, therefore,

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Reminderville, County of Summit, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the resignation of Officer Jackson Pemberton is hereby accepted, and the Police Commission formerly held by Officer Pemberton is hereby revoked, effective August 14, 2024.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal action by this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Reminderville, to wit: to ensure adequate police protection, and if this Resolution receives the necessary number of votes, it shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
